Factors for Successful Relationship in Marriage: An Investigation in Sikkim

ABSTRACT

Marriage is a societal institution and a promise where two individuals come together to form a living. Their relationship is socially approved and sanctioned by custom and law. Having a successful relationship in marriage is crucial for a couple because it will have an optimistic impact on the overall wellbeing of both the couples and their children. The current study aims to explore the factors that have contributed for a successful marriage relationship in Sikkim. To achieve this, a snowball sampling technique method was used to discover 50 successful married couples (25 male and 25 female) who have been together for more than 20 years based on their marital relationship, satisfaction and happiness. An interview schedule was prepared to interview the respondents to find out the factors that have led to successful married life. Such study holds significance in today's society where divorce rates are increasing at an alarming rate ruining both the couples and their innocent children.

As per the census 2011, Sikkim is the third highest state in India, which accounts for 2.16 percentage of population being divorced or separated. This figure is quite alarming and disturbing. Further, the quality of time spent together, optimal problem solving, and conflict management skills also promote high levels of marital satisfaction (Plooy, Kobus Du and Beer, Ronél de. 2018). In addition, factors such as intimacy between the couples and their good health can never be ignored (Zahra, Khezri. 2020). Healthy relationship depends on constructive communication rather than a destructive one (De Netto, Priscilla Maria. 2021). Some of the most common factors leading to successful relationship in marriage are friendship, love, and similar backgrounds and interests (Bachand, Leslie L. *et al.* 2001).

While exploring the attitudes of the young adults towards marriage in India, it is changing with time. Males are accepting their responsibility in marriage life while females view themselves as equal to male in roles of the society. Acceptance rate on social rituals and myths has decreased and participant's view



METHODOLOGY

At the end of each interview, the researcher requested the names of other couples that they knew who were having a successful relationship in marriage for more than 20 years and might be willing to participate in the study. In this way 100 successful couples were interviewed (50 males and 50 females). The investigation was based on both exploratory and analytical methods. Simple statistical technique was utilized both for exploratory and analytical purpose. Descriptive statistics – charts and graphs were utilized mainly for exploratory and analytical purpose. The statistical software namely Microsoft Excel 2010 had been used for processing, analyzing and finally interpretation of the primary data.


FINDINGS AND DISCUSSIONS






Female Male





Fig. 4: Religion: Number of respondent in percent



Fig. 6 (a): Factors that have contributed to the successful relationship in marriage in the study area in percent




Fig. 6 (b): Factors that have contributed to the successful relationship in marriage in the study area in percent

All the respondents agreed that commitment, religion, trust, their children, compromise, tolerance and prayers were some of the factors behind the successful relationship in their marriage. One of the respondent said she has successfully completed 25 years of her marriage on 9th February, 2025. According to her, prayer is one of the main reasons for the successful relationship in her marriage followed by children, compromise, tolerance, commitment, religion and forgiveness. 99 percent of the respondents said patience, forgiveness, loyalty and honesty were some of the factors that have led to the successful relationship in their marriage. 98 percent agreed factors such as support, intimacy and friendship have led to the success of their relationship in marriage. 97 percent believed it is because of spending quality time with each other and constructive conflict resolution method adopted by them when they were in bad times. 96 percent of the respondents said healthy communication, love, appreciation, listening to each other and respect for partner were some of the factors which were very helpful in maintaining good relationship with their partners. The other factors included attraction (supported by 94 % of the respondent); humble (supported by 92 %); kindness (supported by 91 %); focus on 'I' instead of 'You' (supported by 89 %); flexibility (supported by 80 %) and similar interest (supported by 53 % of the respondents).

Marriage is inherently a very humble institution where two individuals come together; raise children, enhance love affairs and domestic sharing. Successful relationship in marriage plays a very important role in the society where children will get an opportunity to be nurtured in such a way that he or she will become a responsible and a good human being.
